Nearly 800 hopeful students sat this year's entrance exam

### **Number One in South Sudan!**

The School Certificate results last year indicated clearly that JDMSS is now the Number One secondary school in South Sudan. This was confirmed by both the South Sudan Embassy in London and by the recent registration at the school, when 798 students applied for the 240 places available in Senior 1. After arduous tests, 268 places were awarded. The school roll

now stands at 888 students.

The prize-giving ceremony was an even more remarkable event; while the entertainment, speeches and prize-awarding took place, literally hundreds of well-wishers, parents and students watched intensely throughout the proceedings. As ever, an absolute success!

## 10 years at JDMSS

Having more students means more suitably qualified staff are required. As ever, the Headmaster and his team have selected a body of competent teachers who will share in the celebrations planned for May, when the school will be recognising the 10 years that the Headmaster has been involved – from his appointment as Chemistry Teacher, through his subsequent positions as Head of Science, School Officer, Deputy Head and then finally,
